THE LANGHE

A CULINARY MOVEMENT

The Langhe, in the Piemonte region of northern Italy, offers visitors a rare combination of natural beauty, award-winning food and wine, and deeply-rooted cultural traditions. Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2014, the Langhe is not only scenic, but it also represents centuries of winemaking and agriculture that continue to shape the region today.

Culinary enthusiasts are especially drawn to the Langhe for its extraordinary reputation. The food scene is driven by the Slow Food movement, which was founded in Bra, and focuses on tradition, sustainability, and high-quality, local ingredients. Because of this ethos, the Langhe boasts 12 Michelin-starred restaurants, including the three-starred Piazza Duomo and La Rei Natura by Michelangelo Mammoliti. The region also celebrates quintessential local dishes like Tajarin, a thin-cut egg pasta; Agnolotti del Plin, traditional, bite-sized pasta stuffed with roasted or braised meats; Vitello Tonnato; Robiola di Roccaverano, a fresh and delicate goat's milk cheese; and hazelnuts. Alba, at the heart of the region, is celebrated for its white truffles, drawing visitors each Autumn for truffle hunts, markets, and festivals centered around one of Italy's most prized ingredients.





VITICULTURE AND HISTORY

Wine is inseparable from the Langhe's identity, with Barolo (the "King of Wine") and Barbaresco standing among some of the most prestigious wines in the world. Made from the Nebbiolo grape, these wines are celebrated for their terroir, complexity, and aging potential. Visitors of the Langhe can tour family-run wineries, taste aged vintages in picturesque cellars, and explore historic sites like Castello di Grinzane Cavour—home to the Langhe Museum, Cavour family heirlooms, Enoteca Regionale Piemontese Cavour (one of the oldest wineries in Italy), and In Vigna, an open-air museum dedicated to the region's wine history.

The Langhe's rich cultural history is also shaped by the Medieval castles that rise above the hills. Landmarks like Castello di Serralunga d'Alba and Castello Comunale Falletti di Barolo, which once served as fortresses and noble residences, are now home to museums, wine enotecas, and exhibitions that tell the story of the region's blended political and agricultural past. Additionally, historic villages like La Morra, Neive, and Barbaresco serve as cultural destinations complete with Romanesque churches, stone towers, and panoramic piazzas.

Perfectly positioned in the heart of the Alta Langa, Villa at Borgo Castellengo has been thoughtfully reimagined as an idyllic retreat for family holidays, celebrations, and intimate getaways.

FOUNDER STORY

Natalie and Chris Nagele fell in love with the Langhe 13 years ago. Drawn time and again to its beauty, history, culinary offerings, iconic wines, and people, they acquired Borgo Castellengo in 2023.

As founders of a software company built on the principle of putting people first, they now bring that same philosophy into a hyper-personal, luxurious experience for guests of Villa at Borgo Castellengo.

As thoughtful stewards of the land, Natalie and Chris are dedicated to the careful restoration of this historical property, guided by a long-term vision to help revive the magic of the surrounding area and support the local economy.





APPROACH TO HOSPITALITY

The Villa at Borgo Castellengo is guided by the philosophy of effortless luxury and a personal approach to hospitality. From the very beginning, every request is carefully considered and fulfilled by our dedicated team.

Upon arrival, guests will find a combination of their personal favorites and local products, including artisanal culinary staples, Barolo and Barbaresco wines, signature bath essentials, and more.

Our team also creates personalized itineraries, thoughtfully curated based on guest interests, and provides them with exclusive access to small, local purveyors, boutique wineries, and once-in-a-lifetime experiences.

At the Villa, we invite guests to embrace the Italian art of *il dolce far niente*—the sweetness of doing nothing—as every detail is considered on their behalf, allowing them to savor each moment.



RESTORATION

Over the past three years, the Villa at Borgo Castellengo has been impeccably transformed from a nineteenth-century farmhouse into a modern, luxury retreat. Every element—from the façade to the fixtures—has been carefully selected to celebrate local and regional Italian craftsmanship.

The Villa's exterior features original and meticulously restored *Pietra di Langa*, a stone traditionally used by farmers, and is now preserved as part of UNESCO's commitment to safeguarding the region's heritage. The first floor and exterior are paved with locally sourced and reclaimed *Pietra di Luserna* tiles, a prized and versatile natural resource, while the second floor showcases elegant oak flooring complemented by original and restored exposed chestnut beams.

Every interior detail reflects Piemonte artistry, from the custom solid oak kitchen cabinets crafted by Dami&Dami, to Nicolazzi bathroom fixtures, and bespoke interior doors and furnishings created by Tesio, a locally celebrated artisan.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Accommodating up to ten guests, each of the five beautifully appointed bedrooms features original chestnut beams, oak floors, and a private sun-drenched balcony—an ideal setting for a morning coffee or aperitivo. The generously sized rooms also offer European Grand King-sized beds with Altrenotti mattresses, luxurious linens, in-room mini bars and coffee makers, custom-designed wardrobes with safes, thoughtfully crafted desks, and spacious en-suites with walk-in showers, double vanities, locally produced Nicolazzi bathroom fixtures, Italian toiletries, heated floors, and more.





SPACES

KITCHEN

Located between the living and dining rooms, the Villa offers a gourmet kitchen, outfitted with luxury appliances including a gas Ilve range with an electric oven, SKS refrigerator, and a Miele dishwasher. A central island with seating provides the perfect place for casual dining or entertaining.

DINING ROOM

Connecting seamlessly to the kitchen and opening onto the terrace, the first-floor dining room features a custom-designed table made from reclaimed elements, complemented by a handcrafted buffet for breakfast service. Outside, the terrace invites guests to savor the *all'aperto* lifestyle beneath a vine-draped pergola, featuring a wood-burning grill and pizza oven—ideal for leisurely meals amidst the Villa's serene surroundings.

BAR

Located just off the dining room, the custom-designed lounge features classic leather armchairs and a full bar, complete with an ice maker, beverage drawers, and a wine refrigerator. The complimentary bar is thoughtfully stocked with regional wines, Italian beers, soft drinks, and aperitivo ingredients.

SPACES

LIVING ROOM

The first floor living room is designed for an effortless indoor/outdoor flow, opening onto the Villa's main courtyard as well as a 495-square-foot terrace, which provides sweeping views of the forest. Complete with custom seating for 10, the living room's main focal points are the bespoke bookcases flanking the wood-burning fireplace crafted from Langhe stone.

COURTYARD

The Villa centers around a stunning, 2,350-square-foot private courtyard—the heart of the home—complete with a lush garden, cozy fire pits, and inviting outdoor seating.

WEST GARDEN

A tranquil escape tucked just beyond the Villa's entrance, the 1,400-square-foot West Garden is designed for unhurried moments and soaking in the warmth of golden hour.

POOL

Surrounded by the breathtaking vistas of the Alta Langa's forest, the 50-foot, heated, saltwater infinity pool was designed to embody the Italian art of *il dolce far niente*—the sweetness of doing nothing. The terrace, laid with local Pietra di Luserna tiles, is complete with 10 daybeds, a heated spa, and an outdoor shower.

WINE CELLAR

The Villa's wine cellar, located on the lower level, is home to a curated collection of 1,000 local and regional wines. Private tours of the cellar, as well as guided tastings in the dedicated tasting room, are available upon request.

CINEMA

Located on the first floor, the cinema boasts an 85-inch TV, Sonos sound system, and Apple TV— all complemented by custom, plush seating.

SITTING ROOM

Featuring direct access to the outdoor terrace, the first floor sitting room provides guests with an inviting space to unwind and enjoy the day.

GAME LOFT

Overlooking the dining room, the game loft is a relaxed, open space centered around an antique game table designed for chess, checkers, Mahjong, poker, and other card games.

OFFICE

A thoughtfully designed workspace on the second floor, the private office is complete with a spacious desk, printer, Castellamonte wood-burning stove, and serene views of the Alta Langa.

FITNESS ROOM

The fitness room, located on the second floor, offers views of the picturesque gardens and provides guests with an infrared sauna, yoga and meditation area, as well as a Technogym with free weights, bench, treadmill, and stationary bike.



SUSTAINABILITY

In addition to honoring the region's heritage and craftsmanship, the Villa's restoration was guided by a strong commitment to sustainability. A 20kW solar panel system powers the Villa, complemented by a rainwater harvesting and filtration system. Triple-pane steel windows, high-performance insulation, and a state-of-the-art heat pump ensure energy efficiency, while electric car charging stations provide guests with a modern convenience.

In just 20 minutes, guests can visit Alba, the white truffle capital of Italy, or sip wine among the celebrated vineyards of Barolo and Barbaresco; in 75 minutes, guests can explore Torino's royal palaces and renowned museums; and in two hours, guests can be in Milano with its world-class shopping and culture. For those looking for a scenic day trip near the water, the Italian Riviera is just two hours away, while Lake Como can be reached in three.

STRADA ROMANTICA DELLE LANGHE

Just beyond the Villa, the seven kilometer “romantic trail” curves gracefully past the Borgo, allowing guests to explore the storybook villages, rolling hills, and sweeping vistas of the Langhe at their own pace.

BENEVELLO

A scenic 15-minute walk from Borgo Castellengo, guests can explore the quaint village of Benevello. Characterized by stone houses, narrow lanes, and sweeping views of the Langhe, the town’s heart is Chiesa di San Pietro in Vincoli, a historic Roman Catholic church, and its 18th century belltower.

Experience Piemonte from every angle—soar above vineyards by helicopter or hot air balloon, cruise charming villages on a Vespa, bike the scenic trails and rolling hills, or tour the countryside on horseback.

Milano, Italy's capital of fashion and design, blends historic landmarks with modern culture. Guests can marvel at the Duomo di Milano, see Leonardo da Vinci's *The Last Supper* at Santa Maria delle Grazie, attend an AC Milan match, and indulge in award-winning local cuisine.

Take in the picturesque coastal charm of Portofino as you stroll along the vibrant Piazza Martiri dell'Olivetta. Discover historic landmarks like Castello Brown and Chiesa di San Giorgio, hike to the scenic Faro di Portofino, or explore the trails of Portofino Natural Park.

MONACO

3 hours

Visit the iconic Monte Carlo Casino, explore the historic Prince's Palace of Monaco, and stroll through the yacht-lined harbors. Guests can enjoy vibrant dining and luxury shopping along the famed Larvotto and Monte Carlo districts, and in June of each year, they can attend the prestigious Formula 1 Grand Prix.

LAKE COMO

3 hours

Spend the day strolling along Lake Como's charming promenades of Bellagio, Varenna, Menaggio, and Como. Explore historic villas, take a scenic boat ride, or hike the Greenway del Lago.

MONTE CERVINO

4 hours

One of the most iconic peaks in the Alps, Monte Cervino—the Italian side of Matterhorn—attracts visitors for skiing, hiking, and simply taking in the panoramic vistas of its snow-capped summit.

Transportation for day trips can include a private driver, helicopter transfers, or the guest's own vehicle.



COMING SOON

In the next two years, Borgo Castellengo will welcome guests to a thoughtfully restored five-star boutique hotel, complete with a dedicated wellness space, a refined restaurant, and event spaces designed for private celebrations, retreats, and intimate gatherings.

Surrounding the Borgo, guests will explore the one-acre, stone-walled, monumental park, find respite among serene flower gardens, and explore three hectares of newly planted vineyards that reflect the agricultural history of the land.

As a true working farm, the estate will cultivate seasonal produce across organic kitchen and herb gardens, a traditional greenhouse, and two hectares of hazelnut groves, while also tending truffle grounds that honor Piemonte's most treasured delicacy.

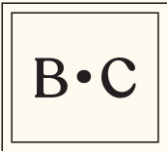
